MENTORING INITIATIVE

The Mentoring Initiative connects young and experienced professionals in the field to learn from one another and develop leadership skills.

CIRCLES INITIATIVE

The Circles Initiative convenes multidisciplinary cohorts (or "circles") of members and young women to explore, connect, and identify strategies for collective action, including:



Girls Leadership & Advocacy

Leverage existing curricula within the Alliance community that train girls in advocacy, and work together to develop a girl-centered advocacy agenda.



Men's Engagement in Gender Equity

Establish relationships with male-serving agencies and allies who share feminist values of inclusivity, equity, and non-violence to foster connections and dialogue.




Girls Leadership Development in Sports

Create a pipeline for women's leadership in sports by building a platform that connects girls and young women to leadership opportunities in community athletics programs.

Amplify Girls' Voices

In 2018, AFG produced an original report: *Girls Leading Change: The Lived Experiences of Girls of Color in San Francisco Unified School District*. This report is a part of AFG's research series on the lived experiences of girls of color and presents critical data on the factors impacting school climate for girls of color. Led by 5 young women researchers, the report amplifies the lived experiences of 97 focus group participants.

Findings are being used to transform the San Francisco Unified School District and the surrounding community.



Advancing a Powerful, Girl-Centered Agenda for Change

TRANSFORMING POLICIES

At the state level, AFG members collectively and powerfully sponsored, championed, and, in many cases, passed policies that not only protect the rights of our most vulnerable communities, but **advance a powerful pro-girl policy agenda in California**. Policies including:

The Tampon Tax (IGNITE)

The Peace Officers Bill (Communities United for Restorative Youth Justice)

The Getting Home Safe Act (Young Women's Freedom Center)

The Child Marriage Bill (Girls Inc. California Affiliates)

The Sexual Health Education in Charter Schools Bill (Stronger California Coalition & Equal Rights Advocates)

The Bail Reform Bill (National Council of Jewish Women)

TRANSFORMING SYSTEMS

Locally, Alliance for Girls and its members are transforming school systems to respond to girls' expressed needs.



- Established a team of district and school site leaders to collectively integrate gender equity principles into practice.
- Co-hosted the first girl-led candidates forum for the School Board to inform candidates of girls' expressed needs and secure candidates' commitments to gender equity in education.

- Trained 100% of principals and the majority of school security officers in landmark sexual harassment policy pioneered by Alliance for Girls Title IX committee: Equal Rights Advocates, Community Works West, and MISSSEY (Motivating Inspiring and Serving Sexually Exploited Youth)
- Developed and implemented a peer-based sexual harassment training for students throughout Oakland Unified School District.
